




Meet Tyler

Tyler is very affectionate and loves cuddles and kissing, especially at bedtime. He has a real empathy with people's feelings especially if they are sad and is a well-mannered and a charming young boy.

Tyler was removed from his birth family after his parents were unable to meet his basic needs. He lacked daily routines, boundaries and supervision which has impacted his development. He is thriving with his foster carers and has developed different skills exceeding expectations. His foster carers say he is a joy to care for. Now Tyler needs and deserves, a family of his own so he can reach his full potential.

Caring for Tyler

Tyler is generally fit and healthy, he does have a moderate hearing loss which is helped by hearing aids.

Tyler has global development delay which may be due to experiencing early childhood experiences and trauma, but is also likely to be due to a diagnosed chromosomal disorder. His condition has had most impact on his language and speech but he is progressing very well. Tyler communicates with a range of sounds, gestures and signs, however he is improving with a range of words too.

Tyler is very well routined and a good sleeper. He enjoys his food but is soya and lactose intolerant, which if not controlled can result in tummy aches and bowel problems. Tyler communicates his pain when this happens.

Tyler attends a special SEN school where he is settled and progressing well.

Could you be the right family for Tyler?

Tyler needs a family who will be are highly nurturing and can continue the indivual care he needs to progress. It would be beneficial if the family had experience of children with additional needs.

A two-parent family is preferred and the family must be mindful of continuing his positive relationship with his siblings. Could you be a family for Tyler?
